Ikos 10

An unassailable bulwark and help was given to the Russian land in the holy Reigning Icon of the Mother of God, which the saintly Elizabeth, received in her convent as a sign of victory over the princes of darkness of this world. Wherefore, having placed all our hope in the reigning Mistress of our land, we praise you as a true and obedient servant of the All-Pure Mother of our Lord, saying:

Rejoice, you were full of the grace and power of God!

Rejoice, you chose the good part, which shall not be taken from you!

Rejoice, you emulated the Mother of God in meekness!

Rejoice, wise virgin of the Gospel, who obtained the oil of grace!

Rejoice, you reverently honored the All-Holy Virgin Theotokos!
