Kontakion 1

Ikos 1

Kontakion 2

Seeing the snares of the devil like a spider's web spread out in the world and feeling in the depths of your hearts that men could be saved only through humility, you cast yourselves down before the Lord in fervent prayer, crying out with compunction:

Ikos 2

Rejoice, you with watchful hearts, did not extinguish the Spirit!

Rejoice, you by your mouths, set forth a mighty preservation!

Rejoice, you pitilessly afflicted your bodies!

Rejoice, you joined mental activity to bodily struggles!

Rejoice, you in your patience, possessed your souls!

Rejoice, O venerable fathers of Optina, beacons of the grace of eldership!

Kontakion 5

Unceasingly and faithfully bearing the radiant name of Jesus in your hearts as an invincible weapon against the demonic armies, you discovered the ever-flowing well-spring of grace; and ascending from glory to glory and adding fire to fire with purified minds, you chanted to God: **Alleluia!** (**People sing Alleluia!**)

Rejoice, you loved the ways of the commandments of God with all your hearts!

Rejoice, you abominated every path of unrighteousness!

Rejoice, you in no way strayed from the path of the Lord!

Rejoice, you trained for the good fight and were not confounded!

Rejoice, you embodied the word of God, having found great peace in Christ!

Rejoice, O venerable fathers of Optina, beacons of the grace of eldership!

Kontakion 8

Considering yourselves to be wanderers and sojourners on the earth, you in no way desired to acquire for yourselves the corruptible things of this world, lest your hearts be dragged down to the earth; instead you cleaved to the one God, in purity offering Him the song: **Alleluia!** (People sing Alleluia!)

Ikos 8

Every passionate attachment of the flesh which separates one from the love of the Lord you rejected with all your souls, seeking the one thing needful. Wherefore, you sat at the feet of Jesus with love which brooked no parting, keeping your hearts from the good things of life and setting all your hope on the Lord. For this cause, O holy ones, we praise you singing:

Rejoice, you finished your lives without any passionate attachment to the world! Rejoice, having freed yourselves from earthly cares, came to know the sweetness of pure prayer!

Rejoice, you with steadfast faith, set aside the concerns of life!

Rejoice, you mortified the pernicious passions by obedience and lack of acquisition!

Rejoice, you in a holy manner, kept the monastic vow of poverty! Rejoice, you were obedient to Christ and cut off your own wills!

Rejoice, O venerable fathers of Optina, beacons of the grace of eldership!

Kontakion 9

Now you hear from us this reverent hymnody:

Rejoice, you sighed tearfully over the misfortunes of the people!

Rejoice, you made room in your hearts for all who had recourse to you!

Rejoice, you sent no one empty away!
